INTRODUCING OUR NEW  
BUSINESS MANAGER -  
MR BEN CULLETON



### 1 What attracted you to the Business Manager role in Kings' School?

I think the biggest draw for me was the fact that it was Kings'. Whilst not a Winchester resident myself (although I have been in the past), I do see Winchester as my spiritual home, and I am fully immersed in Winchester life. I have been aware of Kings' and its excellent reputation for a number of years – I have neighbours whose children came to school here, and my children go to Colden Common Primary School, my wife has sung at the Kings' Christmas Carol concert, so the mention of Kings' is always there on the periphery, and hence, that reputation, coupled with the school's standing within the Winchester community, was the deciding factor when I saw the job advert. Finally, as a retired Army officer, the Kings' ethos and motto resonates with the British Army's values and standards, which was extremely appealing.

### 2 I know it's early days, but what do you enjoy most in your role?

The staff are just amazing. I have been supported and welcomed like never before. In the Army, where I've been used to a nomadic lifestyle and moving on every 2-3 years, that new-job transition has been fairly lax and you are just expected to crack on without much support. Here, that support has been huge, and everyone is just so helpful and friendly. What I find fascinating, is that people are interested in me and my background, a rarity when I'm used to moving from Army job to Army job and everyone's in the Army as well, so even the good leaders I've worked with in the past tend to not show a great deal of interest in you. I have also enjoyed some of the interaction I've had with pupils. I'm enjoying the politeness and respectfulness of the well-mannered young people here at Kings'. All of the parents I've spoken with have been nice too, even when giving me feedback about Hampshire County Council's school bus service!

### 3 What do you hope to achieve during your time with Kings' School?

My role requires me to manage the day-to-day running of the non-teaching side of the school, from the premises, site maintenance, health and safety and budgets to staff and HR processes, all of which are the enabling elements that permit the teaching side of the school to happen. Ultimately, if I can do my job correctly, then it sets the school up for success, the pupils can be enriched with their learning and achieve all that they want to achieve.
